What can be done about dog poo in public spaces?

Many times when dog poo is left behind it's because the owner didn't have a bag or could not locate a receptacle. The City can do our part by providing enough bags and receptacles, but the dog owners need to take responsibility for their animal. The City provides bags and receptacles in the parks and on Main Street. If you see a place that you think needs one, text (802) 309 - 1775 with your suggestion and we can evaluate adding more.

As the City redevelops and increases its population, not every dwelling unit will have a yard. Dogs add a lot to the lives of their owners and the vibrancy of the City. But having a dog in a public space comes with the responsibility to clean up after the dog.

What are the rules around "free piles" of unwanted items in front of my house?

The City discourages free piles. They contribute to social disorder and the unwanted items often find their way to a homeless encampment. The City has a public health and safety ordinance that regulates trash in the greenbelt and can lead to daily fines to the property owner. The ordinance typically kicks in after 24 hours. The best way to avoid the fines is not to have a free pile. Posting unwanted items for free on Facebook marketplace or Front Porch Forum can keep them out of the landfill and prevent them from deteriorating from the rain and detracting from the neighborhood.

Where can a contractor park who is working on my house?

The City grants temporary parking permits to allow parking in places where it is normally prohibited, such as the lawn or greenbelt. Permits are free, but it prevents folks from getting a ticket and allows the property owner and the City to make a plan for repairing spaces that are impacted by temporary parking in sensitive areas.
