## ASK THE CITY

### What is the Federal Street Multi-Modal Connector Project?

The Federal Street Multimodal Connector is an exciting project with the purpose of bringing a multitude of improvements to north-south vehicular, pedestrian and bicycle traffic in the City.

For decades the corridor of Lemnah Drive, Allen Street, Catherine/Market Streets and Federal Street has been used as a de facto bypass to Main Street, as well as a primary route for commercial and residential traffic to access the west end of the City. Nevertheless, this collection of streets was never designed to be the City's second-most important north-south corridor; it just happened that way over time. There is a need to provide clearer connections, better traffic management and safer routes for pedestrians along the entire corridor.

The City has constructed one phase of this project along the Catherine/Market/Federal Street corridor from Allen St. to Hampton Lane. This phase also included improvements to the Lake / Federal/ Catherine / Market St. intersection.

### What's Next?

The City received \$7 million in federal funding in August 2022 to complete the remainder of the project. Planning, engineering, and right of way is currently underway. When complete, the project will include:

1. A traffic signal at South Main Street and the St. Albans State Highway, including a pedestrian phase.
2. A new street linking South Main Street to the southern end of Lemnah Drive.
3. Sidewalks and a new bridge on Lemnah Drive.
4. Improvements to the Lemnah-Allen-Lower Welden Street intersection.
5. A new sidewalk and shared-use path along Federal Street.
6. Upgrades to the traffic signal at North Main Street and Lower/Upper Newton Street.
